

CHORE CHART



This chore chart is a WIN WIN situation for both kids and parents. It's a great way for kids to learn responsibility, to be able to earn some money and to be able to teach them how to manage that money well. For our family, we also want our kids to learn to help around the house **without** getting paid for it, so for us, certain chores won't ever appear on our chart.

Follow the instructions below to customize your chore chart.

Customize your Chore Chart

- 1 Customize the editable chore chart on the next page based on what chores are needed and how much money can be made from completing each chore. *(You may need to download the chart before you can edit it.)*
- 2 Once completed, print off the chore chart and hang it on the fridge or where your kids can see it.
- 3 Kids can choose which chores they want to complete as a way to make some extra money. *Some chores will need training at the beginning but don't worry, this will pay off in the long run.*
- 4 Cross off the chores as they are completed and write the initial of the child that completed it.
- 5 At the end of the week, it's PAYDAY! Add up what each child made and pay them the money they earned. *This is a great time to teach them about spending, saving and giving.*
- 6 Repeat the process. Re-create the chart again based on what wasn't completed the previous week or any new chores you want to add.
